

Mélanie Dupuis-Roy

Script writer and movie director

A cinema lover from Loudun (France), Mélanie discovered cinema practices through an optional class in high school. There, she successfully directed « Il suffit d'un signe », a short film revolving around the subject of disabilities. Attracted by the lights and cameras, Mélanie got into CinéCréatis in September 2014. She worked on the « Sweet Cabage » script for a year which was choosen as one of the three 2017 end of study productions. Determined to direct her screenplay herself, Mélanie produced a true «arthouse film ».

Why Alzheimer's?

Because it affects everyone, up close or from a distance. It's an illness that's as scary as it is intriguing: how to live with letting time, your family and your loved ones go by? I was never personally confronted by this illness, but everyone can identify with the loss of autonomy, the fear of watching yourself disappear.

A story « for better or for worse »?

Alzheimer's disease is the second most feared illness in France after cancer. An illness that doesn't have a cure... Therefore, I wished to portray the perspective of the loved ones, the ones who are facing it. What happens when we are forgotten by the people we love the most?

In the movie, Michèle and Hubert are living a fairy tale, in a small town, where everyone follows suit every day, to allow Michèle to relive the best aspects of her romantic relationship.

A romantic comedy rather than a drama?

I approached the subject from different angles. But I chose to show that «as long as there is love, there is life», and so to try to soften the view on this illness, to keep a message of hope. Sweet Cabage's ambition is not to show the patient's or their family's everyday life as a documentary. I wanted to make people smile rather than cry. I wanted to show that even when we have an incurable illness, continuing to love and be loved, to seduce, even unconsciously, can allow you to maintain a life full of true emotions, not only sadness and despondency.

How to live together when Alzheimer's tries to separate us?

A romantic comedy, but not only!

The difficulty wasn't really dealing with the disease in a romantic comedy, but to double the restraint of a story about elderly people. I'm only 22, which meant I had to put myself in Michèle's place. I did a lot of research, I met a lot of nurses, speech therapists, doctors, to have an all rounded approach on Alzheimer's. But I also wondered about seduction: the criteria and approaches have to be different than the ones we use at my age. Michèle doesn't go out to discos (laughs)! How, at this age, could I be seduced again? The answer, suggested in Sweet Cabage is to relive everyday like it was your first encounter, the feeling of renewal, yet, so common.

Some movies references?


What women want (2006),Something's gotta give (2003), The Holiday (2006)... In fact, I'm a big fan of the director Nancy Meyers because her romantic comedies are not pointless: she openly speaks about elderly women's problems, careers, sexism, adultery, divorce, first steps toward aging... She does all of this while paying attention to every detail, to underline a positive message: from every problem, we can take away beautiful things. In Sweet Cabage, we couldn't imagine that Michèle and Hubert's relationship could be as beautiful and alluring without the illusion of separation that the disease creates.

Learn or teach to young directors?


